PSHE

PSHE this term will focus on developing pupil's understanding of behaviour, rights and respect. We will be exploring what it means to be a good friend, how we should behave in a round school, how we should behave in and around school, how we look after our things and money.

Art & Design

In Art and Design, pupils will be exploring a variety of African Art including printing, weaving, collage and Batik. We will also be looking at how we can recreate Gerald McDermot's spider illustrations.

Music

Keeping with our international theme we will be exploring African drumming, call and response and percussion instruments.

We will also be using our voices to create soundscapes that transport us to the plains of Africa

Maths

Throughout the term we will continue to work on our knowledge of number facts through the mastering number programme.

We will be developing our understanding of multiplication and division, before we introduce the concepts of fractions, position and rotation.

Once these ideas are secure we will move on to numbers up to 100 and then explore money through counting and adding coins together.

Religion and World Views

In religion and world views we will be exploring the question 'Are all families the same?'.

By exploring the different customs and celebrations held by different families we will develop our understanding and knowledge of different faiths and family structures.

PSHE Art & Design Music Religion and World Views English PE

Year 1

Our topic is...

All around the world

PE

This term's PE will develop pupil's understanding of movement through both dance and gym.

Pupils will be looking at running, defending and attacking. We will be exploring the ideas team work and planning by playing games that require team mate to take on different roles, and look at creating strategies that will help us be successful.

Geography

In geography we will be finding out which countries and continents we already know, before we take a closer look our own environment.

We learn about the different continents, which areas are hot, cold, artic or tropical. We learn about the different geographic features that we can find in and around Banbury and comparing them to other locations such as France and Ghana.

English

Children will continue to have daily phonics sessions where they will practise their sounds, word reading and writing. They will then use and develop these skills in English sessions.

In addition to this we will be exploring our books for the term, Bringing the Rain To Kapiti Plain and Anansi the spider. Through exploring these books we continue to develop our ability to decode and write words, form sentences, write descriptively and persuade people to visit a new country, as we learn and explore other cultures from around the world.
