English

Maths

This week, we have continued to learn about halves, quarters, thirds and finding the whole number. For your homework this week, we would like you to write out and complete the questions below in your homework book.

6.	1/4 of ?	= 4

For example: $\frac{1}{2}$ of ? = 5

Step 1. Draw two groups (have a look at the denominator).

Step 2. We know there are 5 in one group $(\frac{1}{2})$



Step 3. We know that the groups have to be equal.

Step 4. There are 5 in each group so the whole number is 10.

Step 5. $\frac{1}{2}$ of $\frac{10}{5}$
